

- CHS navy blue waterproof jacket


















Daily Organisation School Times

Positive Behaviour for Learning at Craigmore High School

Craigmore High School has adopted a Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) framework.

PBL is a whole school framework which helps schools to create positive and engaging learning environments.

The framework supports our school values of Respect, Creativity and Success.

The framework helps to guide the behaviour of everyone in our school: staff, students, parents, and community members.

What is Positive Behaviour for Learning?

PBL is a proactive approach and focuses on teaching all students agreed expected behaviours and pro-social skills rather than just reacting to behaviour errors. In addition, a small number of students require highly individualised and intensive interventions.

PBL provides teachers and students with more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction.

All students, teachers and staff will benefit from:

- increased positive behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- a safe and predictable learning environment, and
- increased adoption of evidence-based instructional practices

What does PBL look like at Craigmore High School?

- Positive Behaviour Expectations and agreed Classroom Expectations are displayed in every classroom.
- Positive Behaviour Expectations procedures for non-classroom settings are displayed in their relevant areas.
- Students can state the behavioural expectations.
- Positive behaviours are explicitly taught, modelled and practised with students and reinforced throughout the year.
- All staff acknowledge and positively reinforce expected student behaviours.
- Teachers strive to use a ratio of 5:1 in the classroom 5 positives to 1 corrective when providing feedback on student behaviour.
- Data is collected and used for decision making.
- It is a team-based approach.
- Families are actively included.

Student Wellbeing and Support Services

At Craigmore High School, the Engagement and Wellbeing structures play a central role in creating a safe and inclusive environment for all members of the Craigmore High School community.

The Wellbeing and Engagement Team aims to support our students to achieve success, both in and outside of school and to ensure that our students receive the necessary supports in order to do so. Our team has a strong focus on relationships and recognises that positive relationships are key to ensuring that our students can access these supports.

Craigmore High School uses the '**Our Values in Action'** framework, shown on page 3 of this booklet, when supporting students' wellbeing and behaviour. Practices used address the interconnection between wellbeing and student engagement and acknowledge that one is not exclusive of the other.



Student Wellbeing and Support Services

Engagement and Wellbeing Hub

The Hub provides the following support for students:

- A safe space for students to regulate their emotions and have time to reflect
- 2. An opportunity to connect with support staff where they can generate effective solutions to their problems
- 3. Obtain a crucial link between students and any support they require
- 4. A space for students to go when they are faced with a stressful situation which, without accessing the space, could have led to them making decisions that result in a negative consequence

Students who have been identified and issued with a 'Hub Card' may refer themselves after a conversation with their subject teacher if they require emotional or learning support. To obtain a 'Hub Card' students must liaise with their Year Level Leader.

Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Student Support

The Aboriginal Education Team at CHS is comprised of: the Aboriginal Education & SAASTA coordinator, Aboriginal Secondary Education Transition Officers and Aboriginal Education Teachers who are dedicated to providing educational, wellbeing and cultural support for all of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.

We aim to provide a culturally safe and inclusive space for our community of successful learners, situated in the Nunga room. This space is always open to parents and students.

We offer a range of programs including SAASTA, Family Nights, yarning sessions, tutoring support, mentoring and wellbeing programs, transition pathways and scholarship assistance and cultural excursions and experiences.

For students who speak English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EALD) Support

The EALD Support Team at Craigmore High School is comprised of two EALD support teachers and bi-lingual student support officers who are available to provide students and families with a range of assistance.

Our EALD students (students who speak other languages besides English) are very important.

They are supported in classes and in our school community in a range of ways:

- In class academic support
- Outside of class academic support
- Mentoring
- Counselling and support
- Additional language study support
- Translation assistance for families
- Extra-curricular leadership opportunities, camps and excursions

EALD support teachers are available in the EALD support room during the day on Mondays and Fridays for extra support.
